Nat'l Bike Races Coming to Detroit

For the first time in the city's history, Detroit will be the scene of the National Amateur Bicycle Championships, America's biggest cycling event, to be held August 31-Sept. 1, will draw more than 475 riders, including the best talent from both coasts.

To give a scant idea of bicycle racing, here are some sidelights on the sport:

Riders weigh 120 pounds as compared to 75 pounds for the kind the average boy or girl rides... they have no brakes and are stopped by placing a gloved hand on the front wheel... the gears are one speed... six-ounce tires made of silk-linen and rubber, with 210 pounds air pressure are on the bikes.

Riders ride bent forward to cut wind resistance and sit tight on the seat to give the legs full extension for more power... many riders wear crash helmets... speeds of 60 miles an hour are attained in short sprints...

Shoes worn by riders are similar to track shoes... but have no spikes... instead a cleat with a slit in the sole... a clip and strap fasten the shoe to the pedal... the cleat is held in place at the slightest pressure.

Garbage Collection

The City of Birmingham will receive proposals for the collection of garbage from residences and business places for the fiscal year July 1, 1940-41.

Bidders shall specify the rate they propose to charge for collection from private residences on the basis of two collections per week, based on a one year license. Bidders shall state what equipment they propose to use and must provide compensation and public liability insurance and provide cash bond in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for faithful performance. Proposal forms and copy of governing ordinance may be secured from the clerk's office.

Bids must be in the Clerk's office by Monday, June 10th, 1940, not later than 2:00 P. M.
