

Hawthorne Signs May Be Changed

Further persuasive efforts by... of Hawthorne drive to get the city to change its recently-installed no-parking signs were made Monday night at the Commission meeting.

L. B. Billings, 348 Hawthorne, declares that because almost all the houses are on the west side, parking should be permitted on that side, and not prohibited.

"Strangers who can't see the signs will pull up in front of the houses and park anyway," he said. "Most of the cars come from Maple avenue and it is only natural to park on the right side of the street."

He suggested that the signs be moved to the east side. He also declared that the signs "Fire Department Route—No Parking" are confusing to strangers who are not certain whether any parking is permitted.

The Commission delegated authority to Manager D. C. Eghert and Fire Chief Vernon Griffith to make any changes they feel are necessary.

more simply—sponge the plant with clear water. A five gallon aquarium is a large enough area in which to grow all the necessary cooking herbs for the winter, etc. as all manner of other plants. It should have gravel in the bottom for drainage and then soil. Plant and water thoroughly. If you then cover the whole with a glass, water very sparingly. In fact it is more usual to have to watch for too much water—a sign of this is the accumulation of large droplets of water under the covering glass. In this case take off the glass and let the garden dry out a bit.
