Restore Ft. Wilkins With Old Photos

COPPER HARBOR—Old war department records, photographs which date from the Civil War, and the researches of historical groups are aiding in the restoration of old Fort Wilkins near the tip of the Keweenaw peninsula. A gift of the United States government, the abandoned fort has been the principal attraction of a state park since 1921. Erected in 1844, year after a treaty with the Chippewas opened the peninsula to mining development, stockade and buildings had fallen into disrepair and some of the latter had disappeared when a WPA restoration project was begun last year under supervision of the conservation department's parks division.

Work of restoration will be completed during the summer of 1941. A new entrance road has been built which leads to a parking area and to tourist camps on the shore of Lake Fanny Hoose and a water system serving the entire park area of 106 acres has been installed. The campground will have sanitary facilities, a laundry and shower building.

Restoration of buildings inside the stockade and of two of the buildings which once housed soldiers, just outside, will continue during winter months. New building foundations have been recently completed and rotted sills are being replaced. New materials are identical with those used in the original construction and the manner of fashioning the new materials is that used by the original builders.

Between 30 and 100 workmen are carried to the fort by truck caravan from Ahmeek, about 30 miles distant, and are returned when the day's work is done.

The old fort housed men who served in the Mexican and Civil wars.

City Gets 202 Lots For Park Purposes

Two hundred and two lots for use principally as parks and playgrounds have been acquired by the city at little or no cost through the recent Scavenger sale. City Manager Donald C. Egbert reported to the Commission Monday night. Deeds are now on hand.

Most of the lots acquired was in the southeastern part of the city, in an undeveloped area. The total secured there was 170 lots.

At Cummings and Eton, following the request of residents there, 16 lots were acquired from the state and two directly from the Leinbach-Humphrey Co. for use as park property.

At Buckingham and Eton, in the northeast section, nine lots were acquired.

Lot 2, at the corner of Shephard and Grand Trunk, has been secured. This gives access from Springdale park to Shephard avenue—a "back way."

Four more lots were acquired at the Derby avenue well site.

When these areas will be developed is problematical. Many other park areas in the city are practically untouched for want of funds.
