Grand Trunk Hits Sewer Project

The new sewerage project for northern Birmingham is still far from being settled, it appeared at Monday night's City Commission meeting when representatives of the Grand Trunk railway protested the assessment.

John Gullif, 536 Southfield, an attorney for the company, declared that the assessment to be charged the railway for a number of lots it owns on the east side of the tracks but west of Etow road, is "far greater" than the benefits which would be derived, he said. He said that the railway owns 80 lots, but has sold only four, even though the original price had been marked down 90 per cent. Sewers now on the property will be adequate, he said, and added that the area charges of \$1.4 a thousand square feet would be acceptable, but not the front-foot charge of \$1.06. Gullif said further that because of their location, it was doubtful whether the lots would ever be sold. (They were purchased when the railroad acquired new right-of-way.)

A Mr. Halliday, of Royal Oak, also a Grand Trunk representative, suggested that only part of the work be done now.

City officials declared that the plan was the most economical they could devise to give permanent relief to the many residents in the section who had asked for it.

"We certainly don't want to build sewers for the people don't live here," said Mayor Donald C. Egbert said. "This project will cost the city at large about 25 per cent of the total cost, \$22,000."

R. P. Cole, 1207 Buckingham, president of the Birmingham Education Association, asked that at a recent meeting of the group, a majority had voted in favor of the project, but approval of Grand Trunk engineers was suggested.

Mayor John E. Martz concluded by saying: "The whole thing simmers down to two things: those who don't have trouble with the sewer; those who don't have trouble don't want it and are not worrying about their neighbors."

The matter was tabled for two weeks for further study.

Antique Dealer Protests License

A "Birmingham Antique Show" to be held at the Community House in December is excluding most Birmingham antique dealers the City Commission was told Monday night by a local vendor, Donald Ephlin, 651 Forest avenue.

Ephlin questioned why the City Commission had approved last week an initial merchant's license for the show when many dealers, all operating separate businesses, will be showing their wares. The license cost \$25, and after hearing Ephlin, the Commission ordered it held up. It had been issued to Mrs. Ruth Farra Manning, 960 Birmingham road, who has been here but now operating in Royal Oak, and also to Ralph Garfield Jones, of Cleveland. These two also sponsored the show last year.

All local dealers but one have been unable to get into the show, Ephlin said.

"There are seven or eight of us trying to make a living here, and it will be really serious if our dealers come in and take away our Christmas business. I feel that each dealer ought to take out a license."

Commissioner Harry E. Bissett was concerned over whether the show was a monopoly, and he suggested that each vendor take out a license.

Next week, Mrs. Manning and the other local dealers will be invited to appear.
