Men of military age may continue to buy, build, or modernize homes of their own under the Federal Housing Administration's program, and lending institutions may continue to advance money for this

purpose, just as they did before passage of the Selective Draft Act. Administrator Stewart McDonald has announced. "There will be no discrimination by the FHA against men of military age," Mr. McDonald said, "and there should be none by the institutions lending FHA-insured funds."
