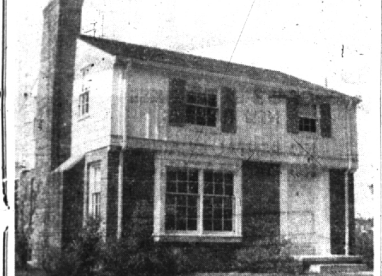
Taylor Speeds Ahead To Get Police Aid
