Use Photofoods
The Electric has acquired a couple of these new Washburn-type lamps for rapid drying of film, and they work very well. At the moment they are being used in the home of fast drying, yours try used the same principle without the special lamp.

The humidity was about 90.9 and a fan had to be used. So we took a couple of No. 2 photofoods close range, and then turned on the fan a short distance away to keep the film from making it worked.

We had to use a wet pattern liquid dryer because the bottle we own requires all hydro to be washed out, and this film had been washed out a minute or two.

East Of Birmingham Defense Courses Free to Students

Registration is open on Tuesday and Thursday nights for a free course sponsored by the Federal government at the Lawrence Institute of Technology, 15100 Woodward avenue.

The classes, which will be held on Tuesday and Thursday nights, will be given in ten-week semesters beginning September 29, according to Harold E. Van Bussan, Lawrence Tech industrial director. There is no tuition charge. However, students may have to purchase textbooks and incidental materials, Van Bussan said.

The course covers time and motion study, tool design, mechanical and structural detailing, engineering drawing, machine drawing, technical sketching, design and detail of special machinery, machinery of iron and steel, industrial plastics, special methods of chemical analysis, materials of aircraft stress analysis, communication engineering, and industrial management.

Additional courses will be announced later, according to Van Bussan.
