December 9, 1941

The regular meeting of the board of Education was held Tuesday, Dec. 9, at 8:00 p. m. The following minutes were passed:

Recognition of Nina Kitts, recipient with grants.

All bonds called for redemption on March 2, 1942 if present to Jan. 1, 1942 interest at 4 per cent to Feb. 1, 1942.

Bid for refunding expense approved.

Appointment of Lane Ramey to a teaching position in the Birmingham School system beginning Feb. 2, 1942 approved. Annual salary \$1500.

The superintendent instructed to make a thorough study and prepare a salary schedule for teachers of the Birmingham School system. Schedule to be presented for consideration before new contracts are issued for the school year 1942-43.

Bills continued in the amount of \$20,232.65. Accounts payable approved at the amount of \$2,250.25. Requisitions approved in the amount of \$1,208.28.

Final Report to refund \$11,500 to the Boiler Replacement Fund. Money borrowed to pay Phosphate lighting.
