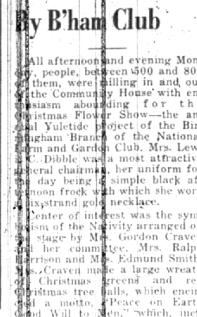
Peace on Earth Theme of Exhibits by B'ham Club
