Good Government Bill No. 1

The new consolidated revenue collection bill which would put collection of more than \$100,000,000 of tax revenue in one streamlined department, headed by a director appointed by the Government, is expected to be introduced in the State Supreme Court after proof of misfeasance or malfeasance in office, has been introduced in both House and Senate.

America's Answer After the War

America's answer to the war, competitive efficiency, says Harold G. Moulton, president of the Brookings Institution. "Both during the war and after, increasing attention must be given to the problem of reducing the cost of production." From the domestic point of view, there is still another need of almost equal importance. That is to hold down, and if possible, further reduce the cost of distribution. It is apparent that if a saving made in the factory is dissipated by waste in the complicated distributive process, the consumer is not benefited. And in the distribution of widely-used commodities, the distribution cost is larger or larger than the manufacturing cost.

And here is where mass merchandising enters the picture. It is as essential a part of our economy as mass production. The two go together—either would be ineffective without the other. It is to the everlastingly credit of American retailing that mass distribution has been brought to a higher peak of efficiency here than anywhere else in the world.

Says Fascism Is A Crime

Leland Stowe, veteran foreign correspondent of The Chicago Daily News, says that unless "Strong German aid is sent soon to the Italian Army, Italy will be completely out of the war." Mr. Stowe has been on the Greek battlefield since the Italian invasion began and he asserts that there can be no discounting of Greek success. The Greek Army, he says, has completely defeated Mussolini's legions and but for bad weather "Italy's humiliation would be complete." Mr. Stowe says that "there is no more fascism in Italy, only a fascist corpse being held up by the Nazis." He gives three causes for the Italian debacle: (1) The Italians thought the war would be a parade; (2) they had poor staff work and made many blunders; (3) they misused their air power, employing it to terrorize civilian populations instead of destroying concentration centers and communication lines.

Which Will It Be?

In the State of the United States a motion has been introduced for the purpose of introducing the doctrine of Hitler and Mussolini. The aim of Hitler and Mussolini has been widely publicized in a desire to destroy democracy and extend the doctrine of totalitarianism to the rest of the world. It is a well-publicized intention of Stalin, the wily neutral, to fasten the collar of Communism on the earth. The immediate objective of Hitler, of course, is to conquer England.

On the other hand, the immediate objective of England is to save herself and save the Nazi armaments of the island. It is a well-known fact that Great Britain is now calling for assistance from the United States. But we have never been informed just what their aims are. Now if we are to render aid to England, Greece and China we ought to show just how far these nations, especially the British, intend to go. Do they expect to help Hitler, then to reconquer France, Holland, Belgium and Norway from the Nazis? Do they expect to restore Poland, including the part now held by Russia, and to force Stalin to return the canal provinces to Finland and to relinquish his strangleholds on Latvia, Lithuania and Estonia? These do they intend to drive the Nazis out of Hungary, Austria, Rumania and Bulgaria and to restore these nations to political dependence on France and Britain? These are some of the possible intentions of Great Britain on which Mr. Churchill ought to throw some light.

Probably this anti-Nazi program is to be carried into effect. The Nazis have been turned back in force after an effort to cross the British Channel, but certainly Uncle Sam will be called on not only to furnish money, tanks and airplanes, but also to furnish troops in aid of Britain. It is at least likely to be primarily a defensive war. Does this defense include the restoration of Europe to its pre-1939 boundaries? Hitler is something we ought to know about.

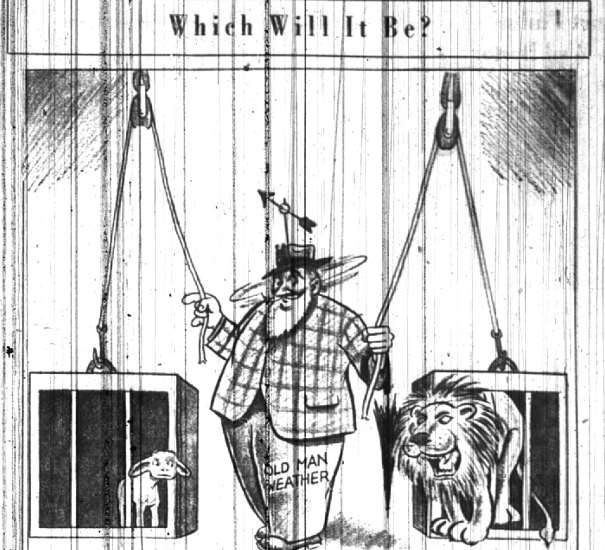
