

U. of M. Little Symphony Plays Difficult Program With Enthusiasm

A fair slice of Birmingham's citizenry turned out Monday evening at the high school for the students' only public concert of the season. It was an audience composed of the city's music intelligentsia plus all those public-minded individuals who were interested in the cause for which the program was being presented—to raise funds to purchase a grand piano for Baldwin High School.

The "Dover Beach" number, which Mr. Van Deuren sang in his first offering, was nearly as unusual. The orchestra, which was accompanied, seemed to have little or no regard for the melodic line which the singer was pursuing. A bewildered and vague feeling of uneasiness nearly all we recall, and that the program is passed.

Program building first of the most difficult tasks that a conductor faces is the selection of the program. It was a rather unusual program that they heard. It contained a Mozart symphony—in A major, number 20, according to Kuhnle's count—three Cesar Franck songs by Hardin Van Deuren, Winter's "Tale Suite" by Arthur, three overtures—Franz Liszt's "Macbeth," Mendelssohn's "Moonlight Madonna"—and Rossini's overture to "Tartuffe." Mr. Van Deuren also sang "Dover Beach."

Nothing noted by the Monitor for a Donald Francis Tovey once wrote, "This composer's work is a liberal education in the meaning of art." The "Tale Suite" is a fine example of the way of Tovey. There's little to write of it; we're still as confused by what the composer was attempting.
