

Bingay Sees End Of the Old Order

Declaring that mankind today is entering a new world order, Malcolm W. Bingay, whose "Morning" column has made him familiar to Michigan generally, addressed members and their guests at the First Presbyterian Church last evening. Mr. Bingay, who was introduced by Earl G. Peter, of Keweenaw avenue, was brought here by the Men's Club of the church.

End of The Old Order

To a capacity-crowded church, Mr. Bingay said that today's epoch-making end of the old order reached its climax in 1789, when men like Leonardo da Vinci, Galileo, Newton, Copernicus, and other discoverers of the laws to determine natural law; these natural laws have since been refined and now the foundation stones of our modern civilization stand. But the development of this world of materialism, which I like to think started with the period of Renaissance, the time of humanism, has found out the spiritual side of its nature. Inhumanity of man toward man has been the theme of the ordinary society of those last two centuries. Now, as the new era comes, men like Hitler, Stalin, and Mussolini come to power; these men are not the creators of today's chaos, but are merely the tools of others that have given up a world whose essential spiritual morals are almost zero."

The speaker stated that we today are in a position to realize that it is our duty to understand them in fundamental detail; he believes that future historians will dwell upon the events as the day of the last materialism.

Development of the means of transportation and communication play a great part in man's progress. This is clearly pointed out. Seventy-five years ago between 2 and 15 millions of Chinese were wiped out in the Peiping Bellicose due to want of travel and communication. It was months before this news reached America, and then our newspapers only gave a brief paragraph on the subject. Today such news reaches us in a matter of minutes after they happen, which only means that the world no longer affords the nation the luxury of a policy of isolation; we are a mere nothing.


