The speaker stated that we today are too close to the problems of our day to understand them in fundamental detail; he believes that future historians will dwell upon these days as the quint of the age of materialism.

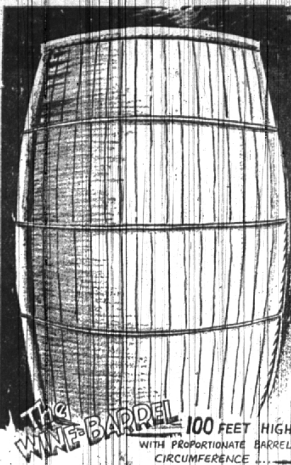
Development of the means of transportation and communication has played a great part in mankind's affairs, Mr. Bingay pointed out.
