LANSING—Instead of a barren farm state government being a liability, it may prove to be an asset of disguise. It is from Gov. Murray D. Van Wagoner whose sense of humor has seldom failed him and whose broad smile has already earned for him the title of "Happy Pat."

Speaking at the Michigan State dinner in Washington, the Michigan executive put the situation this way: "When I propose anything to the Legislature we have in Lansing today, it is to be good. Otherwise you can imagine what chance it has of getting any consideration at all."
