

Unusual Group of Dutch Masterpieces Shown Here by Theodore Millington

The story in connection with the Dutch Masters collection now shown at the Mathews Galleries on South Woodward Avenue, is very interesting. These paintings were produced during the 150 years of continuous relations and Succession wars, they nevertheless show not the slightest evidence of war, nor do they show any influence upon the minds and imagination of the artists of the barbaric invasion of the Netherlands by the Spanish armies, both under Charles the Fifth and his son, Philip.

All signs of hunger, starvation, and destruction of property are absent, showing only the well-fed peasant and the well-dressed, well-stocked table, topped with a scotch-size tumbler of game wine, always characteristic of the works of Pieter Glazee, the Mt. Blue-green horizons of John Breugel the Younger, and Velvet Breugel. The distinctly Teniers inferior with his always complete, unabsorbed card players. The people of that day took work on the skin knowing full well that peace follows war as surely as rain follows sunshine.

The paintings came from the Art Museum of Prague, (Czechoslovakia) where they were part of vast collection made by the Bohemian Art Association for the purpose of showing the evolution of landscape painting during the last 850 years.

Subsequently, the association published a book, one for each member, containing a selection of 20 pictures best showing the progressive steps.

The collection brought by Theodore Millington to the Mathews gallery is all 16th and 17th century and contains one of the 20 in the book, a landscape in a canal scene by Van Vries. These were brought to

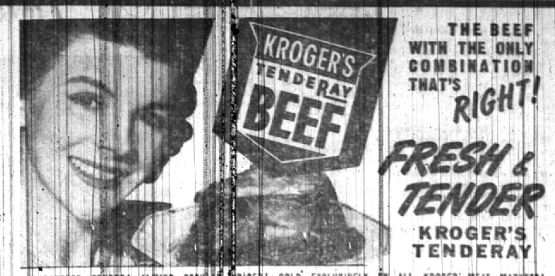
Mr. Schindler appeared last week with the symphony—and made a deep impression on the audience.
