Saturday is the closing date for nominations in the Bloomfield Hills city election April 7, but on Wednesday no one had filed petitions.

It was known that petitions were being circulated for the incumbents on the commission, Mayor Clarence E. Orr, Stanley Davis and Harry J. Kilgore; and also for H. Augustus O'Dell, justice of the peace, whose term is expiring.

Petitions must be in by Saturday at 4 o'clock.

Two amendments to the zoning ordinance were passed Tuesday night by the Bloomfield commission. One prohibits the use of residential areas for parking lots except when granted by the Board of Appeals.

The use of house trailers is prohibited except when they are used for improved property given consent for one trailer for not more than 50 days.

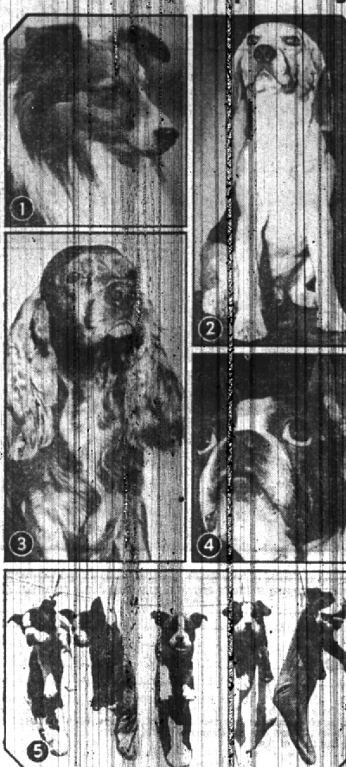

Military Tanks Used 300 Years Ago

ANN ARBOR—Military tanks used 150 years before the present world war are described in an old volume now owned by the University of Michigan Transportation Library.

Heavy wood, sufficient to resist the heaviest fire of those days, formed the armor plates for these early tanks, which were described and pictured in 1888 by Captain Augustus R. Parry, in "The Horse at Arms," a Military Library.

In the case, these tanks were drawn on cast-iron wheels by horses to the rear of the water-filled tank. The water-filled tank was surrounded by a heavy cover of iron plates, which were bolted for smaller, more substantial pieces, and the tank was then steered into the mud.

On either side of the tank were two paddle wheels which, when turned by a man inside, propelled the floating tank to the other side of the moat. In the front of the tank a hole was cut through which one of the crew operated a machine to keep the way clear. At the rear was a rudder or paddle with which one of the crew operated a machine to keep the way clear on the opposite bank.

The tanks could be used to carry troops, or to form the sections of a pontoon bridge over which men, guns and troops could pass. The book, which was printed in

State Tightens Rule On Tax Exemptions

LANSING—Fourteen thousand manufacturers and processors throughout the State have received notification of the State Board of Tax Administration's "Industrial Processing" ruling.

Drafted by Attorney General H. J. Rushford, the ruling covers the tax exemption for "industrial processing" as defined by Sales Tax Director Louis M. Nichols. It states that the new ruling applies to all machinery, tools, and equipment used in the manufacturing process.

All things necessary consumed in a manufacturing process are sold at retail prices. But all machinery exclusively devoted or specifically used in the process of manufacturing an article to be sold at retail prices, both in the State and out of State.
