ed out that the entire district had been sold for single families and that the people there have a right to consideration before the value of their property is reduced by the proposed tank.
If economy is the only consideration, why not use the Overton park and add to it the proposed tank? How much are you reducing the values in a high tax area? You will be treated for the expense of the entire city to one area.
Cross-Purposes.
O'Gorman, representing the home owners' association directors, presented a resolution asking that the tank be placed outside the residential district. The state and city have spent much money to beautify Birmingham, "to show" they were working as cross-purposes to take the corner of Poppleton park for a water tower.
J. S. Hatfield suggested that the tank be placed near Moultrie's lumber yard.
Another site under consideration is Adams Road and the railroad, a site which would cost an estimated \$300 more. Another spokesman at the meeting suggested use of Spriggland park.
When the question of zoning was raised, Commissioner William Coit Allee ventured the opinion that the city would have to sue to supersede such restrictions because of the public interest involved. Allee called for a figure which would show the depreciation which might be expected if the tank were built.
