Plans Revealed for Annual Flower Show in Detroit

The annual spring flower show of the Michigan Horticultural Society will be held at the Convention Hall in Detroit. As of yet, the show will come into being only in the minds of the exhibitors.

Hundreds of thousands of blooms spring forth over-night, buds swell and the garden grows to its full, tanuously, lawns green up all in a minute and can step from the cold bleak winter into spring in all its magnificent splendor by going through a door.

Tropical Garden Most outstanding in the entire exhibition will be the tropical garden staged by the Chrysler Corporation. It is to occupy 35,000 square feet of space. One end of the huge garden will be a jungle, dark, dense and most covetous, where jungle birds such as the egret, flamingo and crane roost, and in one corner, along toward the other end the garden develops gradually until we find ourselves in the English spring garden.

Big Orchid Display In connection with the Chrysler garden there will be staged a magnificent display of hundreds of orchid blooms of choice and very rare varieties. They will be staged in a unique setting and far splendor will be unequalled at any other flower show in the land.

ATISTY sandwich and a cup or two of freshly-made coffee is the non-time need of mothers. If the kitchen dishes are as stationary, fix up your lunch in a tray and carry it into the living room—and relax for the hot coffee and the full with your coffee—it should be just right for complete satisfaction here are general rules and a few sandwich ideas below.
