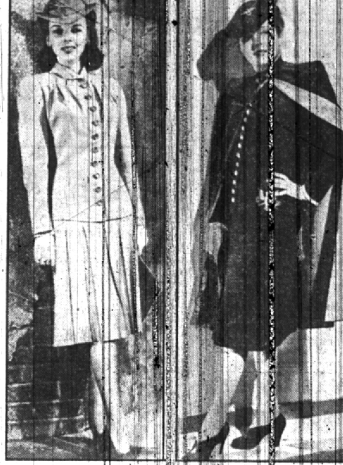
Musicals Will Elect Officers At Next Meeting
