

Club Reveals How Individuals May Buy Lowering Crabapple Trees

To Aid Residents Get Specimens For Private Planting

From now until the middle of April members of the garden club will accept purchase orders for flowering crabapple trees to be planted on private property, it was announced today. Other articles have already been printed in the Eccentric describing efforts to secure trees for municipal and school property, while the State Highway Department will set out a number of trees in the Hunter Boulevard parkway.

Committee of 35
A special group of 35 women will take charge of these private orders, and each number of the garden club and other Birmingham citizens should contact that group, it was said. The group will comprise 16 members of the Board of the garden club under Mrs. L. C. Howe, president; seven members of the Roadside Improvement Committee, Mrs. R. L. Rickenhagen, chairman, and 12 members of a special Tree-Planting Committee under Mrs. Paul Minzel. All members of the garden club will urge their friends and neighbors to let the Garden Club purchase for them 5-foot to 8-foot crabapple trees at \$1.50 each for planting in their own yards and gardens. to make deliveries. It was said. The Malus Floribunda variety of crabapple will be delivered to private individuals, and there is a limited supply of these trees in the particular 5-foot to 6-foot height. The garden club will take a limited number of orders only, it was said. Citizens who wish to purchase these trees are urged to place orders early with the garden club. It was said. Anyone may fill out the form attached to this article and mail it to the garden club. It was said. Other nurseries supply city and school trees will be announced later. City nurseries will plant city trees. Boy Scout leaders by certificate of the schools will plant school trees and private property owners will plant their own trees.

Uses Described
The garden club has offered suggestions to individuals who intend to plant this tree. The Florida-flowering crabapple is excellent for planting in lawns as well as in such as it grows from 20 to 25 feet with a spread equal to its height. The tree should never be placed close to a building. It is not good for bordering a lawn or driveway because of its spreading tendencies. In large areas it is a splendid tree for planting in groups, such as on estates, lawns, etc.

1. SET FRAME ON BACKS TO BEING SETTING UP.

2. WHEN PRELIMINARY HAVE COME TO THE GASH MUST BE SAID FOR VENTILATION.

3. WHEN READY TO TRANSPLANT OPEN BEDS TO A TIME AND GET THEM TO BE SAID AS USUALLY ALLOWED.

4. A BLOCK OF LUMBER IS CONVENIENT FOR BRACING IN ANY HEIGHT NECESSARY.

It is also necessary to remove any suckers or shoots that are not wanted. Pruning should be done in the late autumn or early winter, before the plants go to sleep.

Officers Are Sought For Marine Corps

DETROIT—The Marine recruiting officer for Michigan, Sgt. Louis Charles Fogg, announced today that the Detroit chapter of the expanding Marine Corps during the limited national emergency program is seeking active officers or reserve officers to fill the ranks.

Under a program of training far superior to that given during the normal times, the recruiting officer personnel will be drawn from recent college graduates from 20 to 25 years of age. Qualified candidates for commission will be enlisted for a period of four years as Private First Class in the Marine Corps Reserve. On making application and agreeing to serve for three months of active duty, the candidate will be transferred at Government expense to Marine Barracks, Quantico, Va. Assigned to a candidate's class for approximately three months. During this period, the candidate will be trained in the fundamentals of military discipline. He will be under observation for demonstration of the qualities required of commissioned officers.

Candidates who show commendable progress will be appointed as second lieutenants in the Marine Corps Reserve in recognition of the candidate's class and honorably discharged.

State Has Seedlings For Reforestation

LANSING—A million jack pine seedlings and transplants, and half a million white pine seedlings and transplants are on hand here at the State Land Nursery to fill private and community orders in 1934. The conservation department's forestry division announced today.

The young pine trees are sold to private purchasers for reforestation only. Small lots of seedlings are supplied free for school and community forests planted on publicly owned land.
