## Call Rally to Boost County Library Idea

Invitations are being issued by the executive committee of the proposed Oakland County Library to attend a public rally Thursday evening at 8:30 p.m. in the Auditorium at 8 p.m. The purpose of the rally is to demonstrate to the citizens of Oakland County the need for a rural library service and to suggest action to obtain it.

### \$10,000 Without A Library

A recent survey of Oakland County libraries conducted by the Committee has revealed that there are more than 50,000 rural residents without direct access to a public library, and that the same number live on the outskirts of cities who must pay a fee to borrow books. It was felt that the 15 communities under the county's control are entitled to 10 public libraries, and that these, 10 are south of Pontiac and 5 north. It is suggested that the rural residents of Oakland County are entitled to library facilities in nearly as populous areas as those now received by city dwellers.

The proposed County Library modeled on the successful experience of eight county libraries in the state of Michigan would distribute books to rural schools and communities by book truck. Convenient stations would be established in existing homes, factories, grain filling stations, stores, grange halls, and other central locations. The bookmobile would make stops at all points where books are wanted.



## Questions and Answers

Q. What precautions should be taken to insure a wood casement window being weather tight?

A. In general, wood casement sash should be installed weather stripped and should have a mullion or post outside near the bottom of the sash to hold the sash from running into the point in the frame.

However, to insure weather-tight casement windows, the use of glass wash will be required.
