

# Youth, 12, Gets High Lifesaving Award

Leonard and Harold Pickering, brothers in troop 206, were given high Boy Scout honors last Friday night for their service in the heroic rescue of Richard Morrow, age 7, from the icy waters of a lagoon on the Cranbrook School grounds last December. Troop 206, of which Leonard and Harold are members, was presented to Leonard by Col. Edwin S. George, vice-president of the Detroit Area Council. A citation from Daniel Carter Beard, chairman of the National Boy Scout Court of Honor, was also given to both youth who is 12 years of age.

Beard's Surface Answering the call for help, and diving into the ice covered water, Leonard had to go beneath the surface three times to reach the drowning boy. After grasping him by the collar of the water, and the lad toward shore. The younger boys was after the water about 15 minutes and finally revived him.

Being exhausted however, Leonard sent a younger boy for his brother, Harold, 17, who pulled both boys out of the water and administered first aid. It applied respiration to the Morrow lad for 15 minutes and finally revived him.

For these heroic actions, which showed clearly his Scout training, Harold was given a citation by the Boy Scouts of America, and an honor medal for bravery by the



Leonard Pickering of friends and parents were present to witness the events. Nearly 250 Scouts took part.
