

The Legislature Isn't So Bad After All, Writes Alleman in His Weekly Letter

STATE CAPITOL, Lansing—The legislature swamped with a traditional eleventh hour rush.

Steering committees of the House and Senate, which work may be completed within two or three weeks, the date of adjournment may depend on progress of the house appropriation bills.

While accomplishments to date do not appear on the surface to be significant, legislative session may be said to have the following benefits:

1. Time acts as a sieve to pull much of the good, reject much of the bad.

This democratic method of government may not be streamlined. It does not mean that the conception of business efficiency. Time and money apparently are wasted.

The state sales tax is a pre-tax source of revenue for state needs and local aids. We can afford to have the legislature is largely rural and its members in their membership."

30-Day Curse

While insisting on the right of labor to collective bargaining which never materialized, Governor Van Wagoner is said to be convinced that governmental cutbacks are needed to stem down the cost of war defense industries and a resultant loss of vital arms production.

Furthermore, as a result of the five percent trim in costs in a two-year increase of 200,000 men in the state police force, he supports an appropriation of \$200,000 annual expense support, 3,500 home guard troops. The home guard would not be used for state duty. However, its organization is required by federal law, the governor points out.

The Handy-Dandy "labor-strike" bill in the House, which was a direct offshoot of the Ford strike, is being reviewed with considerable bipartisan support.

Changes would include:

1. The right of union members in a plant to organize under auspices of the state labor mediation board. A bare majority of 51 men in a plant will be needed to make a strike legal. (Sponsors say this safeguard would hold off 200 walk-outs.)

2. A legislative step-up to the present day negotiating time required for strikes in national defense plants. A month's notice for strikes of this type is at present required. An administrative ruling of the state board, supported by the attorney general, will limit restrictions to exacting laws.

Time is short. Legislators must run for re-election in 1942. Figure it out for yourself!

Rotarians, Monday, saw demonstrated methods of teaching the deaf, carried off at the Birmingham School. Mrs. Alice Klein, the director, was the speaker and he brought with him two children, one 12 years old and the other 10, who were born deaf. The results secured at the school.
