Dondero Wants Waterway But Not Pork Barrel
The people of the 17th congressional district of Michigan, to whom I am directly responsible, are familiar with my stand in behalf of the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Seaway and my efforts to obtain favorable action for its completion.

After prolonged hearings in the committee, a large number of other projects have been added until it represents one of the most gigantic omnibus bills ever presented to Congress by the Rivers and Harbors Committee. It will total more than one billion dollars. Many of the projects have no connection with national defense.

Being anxious that the benefits of the St. Lawrence Seaway should not be lost to the people of our congressional district, and fearing that if it were included with the multitude of other projects not needed at this time, it might be rejected, I wrote to the President offering a suggestion which I believed would be helpful.

I am of the opinion, however, that if the proposed Rivers and Harbors Omnibus Bill is presented to Congress in its present form, containing a large number of highly controversial projects which have been heretofore defeated in both House of Congress, that it will not be approved.

The total of projects now in the bill and to be included therein exceeds one billion dollars.

In order that we may serve the nation best, I suggest to you that the projects included in the omnibus bill which are essential to our national defense be segregated from the other projects and presented to Congress in a separate bill for its consideration.
