

Choral Evensong At Christ Church Sunday Afternoon

At four o'clock on Sunday afternoon, Oct. 13, there will be a service of choral evensong at Christ Church Cranbrook.

E. W. Hill, organist and choir director, has long felt that there are great opportunities and possibilities in the traditional English "evensong" services which have been generally neglected in this country. This Sunday the musical service at Cranbrook will be an attempt on his part to bring back this well-established and beautiful form of worship.

Although choral evensong is a rare experience for many people, the elements which comprise it are familiar. The service is the customary service of Evening Prayer, only elevated and beautified by being set to some of the most venerable as well as beautiful music in the Christian tradition, or as it is sometimes thought not accurately termed, "Anglican Chant." Largely medieval in origin, these plaintive tunes are sung antiphonally. It is often remarked that the very simplicity of these tunes lends them their worshipful and otherworldly quality.

The selections by the choir will include "Marek" by William Byrd, a part of the Bach cantata No. 26, and a Russian selection by the well-known Tchaikowsky. Mrs. Lois Chapman and Hugh Davis will take the solo parts.

The service will also be enriched by organ selections by Mr. Hill, written by Soreley and Hunt.
