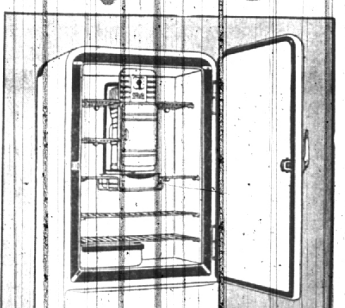
Reckless Driver Pays \$10 Costs

Ruth Draper First On Town Hall List

Ruth Draper, creator of the one-woman theatre, will open the Detroit Town Hall season in the Fisher Theatre Wednesday morning, Oct. 15, at 11 o'clock, in a program of her inimitable sketches. This rare occasion will be Detroit's first glimpse of this great actress since 1935 when she appeared at the "Bright Theatre" for a three day engagement.

Miss Draper returned to Broadway last winter after a retirement of several years in a joint performance with her nephew, dancer Paul Draper. They were an unusual pair. "The Drapers are emphatically tops" wrote the "Bright Theatre" "Bright Theatre house!" reported the Herald Tribune.

Her universal appeal has made Miss Draper a delight to audiences in every nook of the globe.

Six Philip Gibbs will be the second speaker of the series of 20 Wednesday mornings. He flies by airplane from London to speak Wednesday Oct. 23 on "The Spirit of Britain."

Edward Tomlinson, NBC's import American advisor, will report on South America Wednesday, Oct. 23. For the past 10 years Mr. Tomlinson has been a regular tour of the southern Hemisphere. This year his weekly Saturday broadcasts from South America have been a feature of the Blue Network, listened to by millions.
