"The board of trustees created a board of trustees of the territory with twenty members. Plans were laid for a new institution. Because the Archbishop Land company granted a site of 10 acres of cleared land, Ann Arbor was chosen for its location."

"As early as 1833, when the first public school in Michigan was opened, Michigan had led the nation in the establishment of free schools operated at public expense including grade or elementary schools, the academy or high school and the university. This plan was drafted in Marshall by the Rev. John D. Pierce in collaboration with General Isaac E. Crary, first attorney of Calhoun county and representative to Congress from 1816 to 1840."
