

Says Deer Hunting Should Be Better

MARQUETTE—As waterfowl and small game hunters began their season shooting in auspicious weather, I. H. Bartlett of the conservation department's deer division hopes that deer hunters, if they get favorable tracking weather, would be more successful this fall than in several years past.

After completing an informal deer count survey Bartlett said conservation officers are seeing more deer this summer than in the past three years, and that observations of veteran woodsmen bear out the officers' reports. Starvation has been slight among upper peninsula deer because of the mild winter.

In the more heavily deer populated areas in northeastern lower peninsula, however, starvation took a heavy toll of young deer last winter, the number of young bucks seen this summer seems below normal, and the hunting there will not be as good as last year, Bartlett said. Where winter food still is plentiful in northern Michigan, Moose Lake, Cheboygan, Otsego, Emmet and western deer hunting success has been or surpasses that of the past few years, Bartlett believes, if weather conditions are favorable.

In northern lower Michigan, Leelanau county still is closed to deer hunting, because of the Legislature's delay in adjourning, there will be no deer hunting in Leelanau county, either this season, and shooting of does or antlerless deer remains outlawed.
