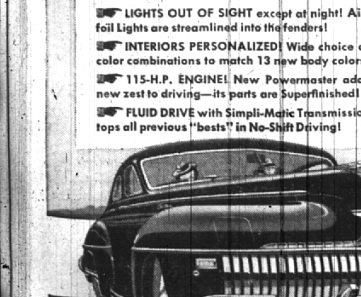

Secretary Knox announced the enlistment drive for Uncle Sam's new Two-Ocean Navy several weeks ago, many young men have asked if they were eligible to enlist without a high school education.

Russell H. Fisher, Commander of the Birmingham American Legion Post answers this important question for the young men of this city. "Navy enlistees do not have to be high school graduates," said Commander Fisher. "Any ambitious and patriotic young fellow who wants to serve his country has the opportunity now by joining the United States Navy of Naval Reserve. Q. What is the Treasury's purpose in putting Defense Savings Stamps on sale in retail stores throughout the Nation?  
A. To make it as easy as possible for Americans everywhere to buy these stamps, which is very important, as they are exchanged at many post offices, and banks for Defense Savings Bonds.  
Q. Note: To buy Defense Bonds and Stamps go to the nearest post office, bank, or savings and loan association. Also stamps now are on sale at most retail stores.
