(Continued From Page 2) As a heading on the apparent business of the print. With very few but very dark enlargements, there is a minimum of "graininess" and a maximum of detail. The graininess is more noticeable. Two Other Conditions Two other conditions which are of great importance in making the print. Soft contrast helps tend to reduce graininess, whereas extra-hard contrast emphasizes the grain. The softest contrast is the best, while rough surfaced papers help to increase it. Of course, there are some other factors that influence graininess, but the foregoing are, most important and are the ones which are subject to control. Proper attention to these factors will result in improved results.
