CONGRESSIONAL COMMENT
51 Billion Dollars
The first session of the 77th Congress, which convened Jan. 3, 1941, eight months ago, has appropriated more than \$5 billion in aid to the states. This is the total appropriated by the three sessions of the 76th Congress.
The startling feature in this situation is the fact that this total of \$5 billion and this money equal the combined wealth of 100,000 families, or one-sixth of the total wealth of the United States. Not only is the Federal Government spending this money, but the national debt steadily climbs upward to the higher peak in the history of the United States.
In 1932 we conducted all Federal Government functions with staff of 570,000 persons. Since that time the number of Federal employees has steadily increased.

CONGRESSIONAL COMMENT
The total now is in excess of 1,365,000 persons, almost two and one-half times the payroll total for 1932.
The national debt on June 30, 1941, was \$48,961,443,585, in addition to approximately \$4,500,000,000 in contingent liabilities or a total of nearly \$53 billion dollars. It is now estimated that by June 30, 1942, the national debt will reach a total of 73 billion dollars in direct and indirect obligations without any further changes in legislation.
Almost every year during the last 20 years, no less, we have balanced the budget. —George Santayana, Lib. de Esquima.

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
