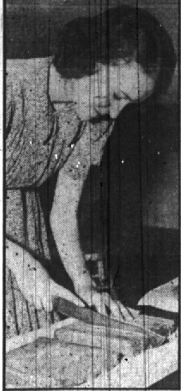


SOCIAL BRIEFS
