

Organist of Church Ends Work Easter

Ellwood W. Hill has been granted a leave of absence as organist and choirmaster at Christ Church Cranbrook for the duration of the war. He formally relinquishes his responsibilities following the Easter services.

Mr. Hill was graduated from Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn., in 1929. Later he completed his course of studies at the Union Theological School of Music in New York City. He began his duties as choirmaster and organist at Christ Church Cranbrook in October, 1938, and has for the past 3 1/2 years served in that capacity. The choral music at Christ Church Cranbrook under Mr. Hill's direction has made an unusual contribution to church music in the whole State of Michigan.

On March 15 Mr. Hill married Miss Lee Pope, daughter of Gustavus D. Pope of Bloomfield Township.
