

Preaching to the Soldiers

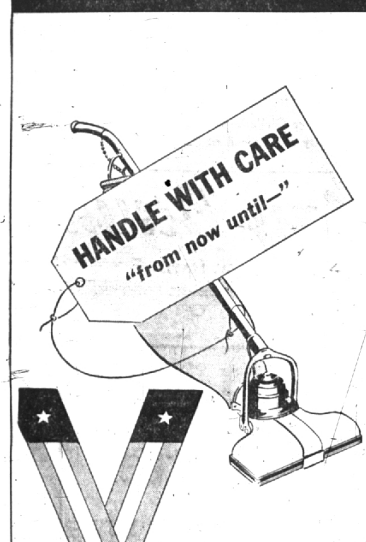
(Editor's note—This is the second in a series by the Rev. W. Glen Harris, local minister, relating experiences during six-week tour of Army bases.)

ALUABLE TIPS on the care of your vacuum cleaner

- FOLLOWING THESE SIMPLE RULES will help to maintain your vacuum cleaner in good condition and may avert possible trouble:
(1) Empty the dust bag frequently.
(2) Keep brushes free from hair and threads.

(5) Repair or replace brushes if tufts become worn.

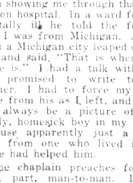

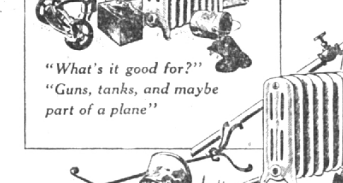

The meeting of the Eastern Michigan Fundamental Baptist Fellowship at the Calvary Baptist Church on Aug. 25 was all that was expected and much more.

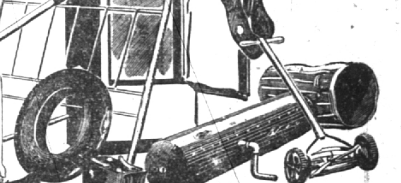
The meeting was spoken of by many of the directors and others attending as one of the most triumphant conferences ever held by the Fellowship.
