Business Women's Club The Christmas Tea of the Business Women's Club will take place Sunday afternoon from four to six in the Birmingham Community House with a program of entertainment.

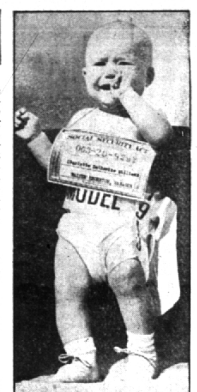
