

War Stamp Gifts Are Encouraged in Merchants' Drive

"No Gift without a War Stamp" is the theme Birmingham and Michigan's retailers have chosen to keynote their drive to collect war savings stamps and bonds between now and Christmas.



BRUCE GREGORY of Birmingham, formerly in charge of sales of the Thornton Tandem Company of Detroit, has been made vice-president in charge of sales and a member of the board of directors, according to an announcement made by A. P. Knobloch, president.

The Michigan Retailers War Savings Committee has prepared a little gift card, to be included with individual Christmas gifts, and in it is a slot into which a war savings stamp of any desired denomination may be inserted.

After his graduation from Michigan in 1926, where he was rated a star halfback, Mr. Gregory was with the sales department of Firestone two and one-half years. Following this he was with the General Tire for over nine years, occupying the position of central divisional sales manager when he resigned to enter the field of motor transport.

A good portion of the retail stores in Oakland County are actively participating in this program of offering War Savings Bonds and Stamps to their customers, as requested by the U. S. Treasury Department.
