Story of Ethyl Gas Told Rotary Club
The story of the discovery and development of motor fuels, more especially that of ethyl fluid for use in gasoline, was told Birmingham Rotarians Monday noon at the Community House by L. A. Dollahan, Michigan representative for the Ethyl Corporation. His speech was illustrated by motion-talking pictures.

Mr. Dollahan explained that ethyl was discovered after 40,000 experiments had been made under the direction of Charles H. Kettering of General Motors Research. The fluid makes the mixture more perfectly combustible, overcoming "knocking" in the motor. He stated that improvement in motor fuels has made the United States supreme in the development of internal combustion engines, and that this progress is being reflected in this war by superior fighting equipment. The speaker was introduced by Rotarian Howard R. Estes.
