WAR NEEDS MAY BE MET

IN 1941, about \$300,000,000 was spent by defense industries in

IN 1941, about \$300,000,000 was spent by defense indistries in Michigan for new plants, new machinery and equipment, in preparation for war-materials production. That is a big sum of money. Nearly 10 per cent as large, the \$28,250,000 spent by Michigan Bell for new construction was a record figure because of the same urgent defense needs. When industry expands for rearmament, it reaches for the telephone.

To next the greatest demand for service in history, new telephone buildings, cables, and central office equipment yere rushed into operation.

Telephone people had a big job in 1941, but/surmounting that problem only served to condition them better to face the more difficult task in 1942.
