Officials Wonder Whether Six Is a Lucky Number

Will "history" repeat in Birmingham's latest quest for water? Just now the Ohio Drilling Co., of Massillon, Ohio, is sinking a sixth test hole in search for a new well site, and City officials wonder whether this location will duplicate a previous search, in which the sixth test well resulted in the blue-ribbon producer on Southfield, best in Birmingham's history.

Recent failures occurred in two holes near Quanton Lake; also on the Poppleton Field property near Hunter boulevard, on a site picked by means of a diving rod; a fourth was at the south end of Pierce street; and at a fifth near the old water tank.

Now the equipment has been moved to a 38-acre parcel of land at the southwest extremity of the City, recently acquired by the Board of Education from the State, gratis. If water is found, the City will work out some kind of a deal for use of a small chunk of the acreage.
