

### Local Chairman Describes the Aims Of Savings Stamps

The goal of Michigan's retail merchants, 61,000 of them, is to begin to realize what these war stamps will actually buy, they will want more and more of them.

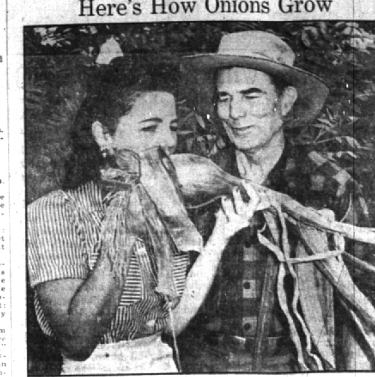
