Home Nursing Grads Are Enthusiastic

A heartening report came to our ears this week from a group of enthusiastic women just completing a home-nursing class, sponsored by the Red Cross and taught by Mrs. Agnes Stanley, R.N., M.S.N.

This type of class, as you may know, includes practical facts and procedures essential in safeguarding the family's health and the physician. It is in short an introduction to the homemaker of medical care during health and illness and of the prevention of disease. Much stressed on sources of available literature.

The results of such a course are hard to define, but as one member of the class said, "We can't emphasize enough the practical knowledge we received. We know we are better able to meet illness in our homes as well as to go into other homes to help out if necessary. With doctor and nurses less and less available there is a definite need for home nursing knowledge. We urge every homemaker to take this course—she will feel well rewarded."
