Grand Choir to Repeat Requiem

"The Mazoni Requiem," by Verdi, will be sung for the second time this month by popular Verdict, Sunday afternoon, March 22, at four o'clock by the choir at Christ Church Cranbrook, under the direction of E. W. Hill.

The soloists will be Lois Griffiths and Hugh Davies. This work is of a different style from the music usually sung in churches. It is a more dramatic and spectacular type than is generally associated with sacred music. If one recalls that Verdi wrote the "Requiem" for the opera, "Aida," "Rigoletto," and "Il Trovatore," this difference will be understood.

Donald Francis Tovey has made some interesting comments on Verdi and his "Requiem." The following sentences are from his memory of the friend, the poet, Mazzoni, Verdi devoted his greatest inspirations, with the whole resources that he had accumulated in "Aida." All his life he had been a composer for the theater. To expect him to produce anything like an ecclesiastical music would be humbly absurd. We may be very sure that Verdi's "Requiem" stands at no disadvantage from its theatrical style.
