Appeal Made for More Wastepaper

Approximately 55 per cent of the paper used in Birmingham is being burned or discarded, according to a statement made by George M. Davis, chairman of the Michigan Association of Paper Manufacturers.

Urging people to become more thrifty in their use of paper, Davis pointed out that in the years when production of paper was at its peak, the consumption was not necessary to save old paper. But today, he said, it is necessary to conserve every pound of paper which can be produced.

To further prove her point, Mrs. Davis explained that defense requirements this year have consumed one quarter of the more than eight million tons of paper produced in this country.

A few of the indirect and direct military uses for paper materials include: a million and a half tons of paper shells used in the production of incendiary bombs; other thousands used by the armed forces.

Mrs. Davis, in commenting on the local appeal, said "Many items which do not occur to the average housewife are scarce. Such things as toilet paper, paper napkins, and other household goods, are in short supply, necessitating a tremendous increase in production and an attendant waste of raw materials."
