Coats that are Simple, Suits that are Soft, Promise the Most Wear

Girls spread on color with broad strokes reflecting the trend of the times toward bright clothes to relieve tedium. Gay red, green and plaid coats and suits will run rampant this spring. Tops on the list is the boxy square shoulders and saddle-coat made of fleecy, twined or other rough and ready fabrics are roomy enough to hold all their treasures. It has fly front

or is fastened with three big buttons. This type of coat often comes with matching suit to make a versatile three-piece costume.

Coats Girls Like

The loose wrappy top coat with the belt pulled tight about the middle stands high in junior affections. It has soft body lines, rayon sleeves, the inevitable big patch pockets and plenty of swing to the skirt. Big bold plaids are most effective, such as chocolate and vanilla brown and cream, brown, powder blue and cream.

Somewhat more sophisticated is the turtleneck in navy or pastel shades, red or green fleecy, rain-like patterned tweeds. It is nicely fitted and has interesting pocket details. A crisp note is white pique collar, removable for laundering. In this styling, the charming, sister coats of navy novelty flannel made from naphthalated wool. They are double breasted and fastened with white pearl buttons.

Military Air

Any girl just adores uniforms—the designers oblige with trimly tailored military coats complete with epaulettes, brass buttons and official looking patch pockets buttoned with a flap. A broad leather belt gives the coat military note. With this can be had a suit styled just like the coat.

As in coats, bright red is a favorite suit color. Sometimes it is combined with navy in a patriotic effect. A smart boy's jacket in red is gated with pleated navy skirt. The jacket has navy collar and pocket flaps to match the skirt.

Gay checks and plaids are a good choice for young flocks. Very attractive is a sartorial in brown, blue and beige checks with matching skirt, box pleated front and back. The coffee bean shade may be worn with it. The coat has arm straps so that it may be worn cape-wise.

Speaking of capes, sweeping in the tweed outfits have tailored capes falling in straight slim lines from the shoulders. The skirts are slightly flared.

Mother and daughter suits are offered in Shetlands, basket weaves and windupweave checks. These are styled in classic models for the softer shirtwaist type. Jackets are longer, with soft waist line and gently draped hood. Patch pockets with stitched and buttoned flaps give a smart finish.

Dressy Blouse-Type Sweaters Popular

Blouses and sweaters will be important, of course, in view of the wide stress on suits. Classic shirts-care in as usual... But with the new note of French cuts plus the gladiolus of cuff links. Then there is the softer
