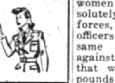

Civilian Army Work

Civilians seeking information, other than that pertaining to enlistment, regarding possible employment in any branch of the War Department, were advised today by Major General J. M. Cunniff, commanding the Sixth Corps Area with headquarters in Chicago, to apply to the office of the Personnel Placement Agency, which is the branch of the War Department, Detroit.

At these offices applicants seeking information who possess necessary qualifications will be given a questionnaire to fill out upon return of which a tentative classification is made. If consideration of the questionnaire is warranted, the appropriate arm or service of the Army.

It was emphasized by General Cunniff that the questionnaires submitted as commissioned officers, although information furnished might, in some cases, result in the consideration of the individual for a commission. However, a person who has not attained his thirtieth birthday will not be considered unless he presents satisfactory evidence that he has extraordinary professional or technical qualifications for duty as a commissioned officer in the particular War Department assignment he seeks.
