The May 18th; retail prices of services in connection with goods, order effective July 1st.) March price ceilings must be posted in each store.

CONTROLLED PRICES.—The following are among the millions of everyday articles controlled by the price restrictions:

Bread, beef, pork, sugar, fluid milk, cream, ice cream, canned meats, canned soups, canned vegetables, cereals, hard coffee, tea, clothing, dry goods, yard goods, salt, soap, fuel, cigars, pipes, chewing tobacco, drugs, toilet articles, furniture, hardware, farming supplies.

UNCONTROLLED PRICES.—The following articles are among the relatively few articles not controlled by price restrictions. (These in most cases include agricultural products.)

Eggs, poultry, butter, cheese, fresh seafood, game, dried prunes, dried beans, leaf tobacco, most nuts, linseed oil, animal feed, books, magazines, motion pictures, newspapers, domestic cars, stoneware, toys, plywood, stamps, coins, art objects, used automobiles, securities, rosin, turpentine.

NO "BLACK MARKET" HERE.—To protect themselves and reputable merchants, consumers must buy only at controlled prices. Penalty for violation of the rules calls for a \$5000 fine or a year's imprisonment or both; civil suit for treble damages and revocation of the seller's license for one year.

Mosquito Shuns Treated Water

Gardeners and fishermen alike will rejoice later on this year if thoughtful persons take time out now to treat water surfaces with some anti-mosquito precautions.

The job is so simple it would appear to be good business for resort owners and home folks to reduce the buzzing, biting populations of summer pests, suggests Prof. E. J. McDaniel of the Michigan State College entomology department.

For large water surfaces, such as ponds or large puddles, a dusting of Paris green will do the trick. The quantity should be small to avoid injury to plants or other insects. A half pound of the powder provides enough dust to cover a half acre water surface. The powder is applied by scattering with a duster.

The treatment kills mosquito larvae and discourages adult mosquitoes from laying eggs on the treated water area. Puddles in fields or ruts in roadways should also be treated to complete the control.

Householders with garden pools can do the job with goldfish instead of the poison. One suggestion from Professor McDaniel is that the fish should not be too well fed. If the goldfish are kept hungry they'll live longer and mop up the mosquito larvae with greater efficiency.

Small Inland Lakes At High Levels

LANSING—Small inland lakes are beginning the season at their highest levels in years and many larger ones have recovered the entire loss of recent drought years, the conservation department's geological survey reports, announcing at the same time that northern Michigan ground water levels are now at the highest point in the eight years for which careful records have been kept.

Lake George, in Clare county and Otsego Lake, are reported a full foot above the previous record high.

The ground water levels averaged in 54 shallow wells in Roscommon, Crawford, Missaukee, Otsego and Kalamazoo counties now stand 0.38 foot above the highest previously recorded level, which was registered in April, 1936. With normal precipitation, the average level is expected to remain relatively static for about 30 days, then decline two to six inches in months during the season of plant growth and high evaporation.

Offer Math Course For Air Navigators

ANN ARBOR—A new course, designed to help speed up the training of navigators for the Army Air Force, will be presented during the University of Michigan's new summer term which starts in June.

Entitled "Mathematics 20: Air Navigation," the course will be taught by Prof. Harry C. Carver, a member of the University's mathematics department, who has mapped out the new course at the request of the War Department.

Professor Carver enrolled Feb. 7 as a cadet in the Air Force, under special authority from the Secretary of War. He has spent seven weeks in training at Kelly Field in Texas and the course in air navigation he has planned is based upon his actual experience.
