Ranging over many degrees of latitude and longitude, Michigan comprises a wide variety of vegetation which is the direct result of her climate, soil and geologic history.

Outstanding examples of these three forests are shown in three dimensional exhibits in the Hall of Michigan Plant Associations.

Reproduced here is the evergreen forest north of Fort Wilkins, near the tip of the Keweenaw peninsula where pines, cedar and spruce shelter shade-loving arbutus, star flower, bunchberry and pipsissewa.

Also featured for Members' Night is a special showing of stones beautifully mounted in silver by Mary G. Goddard.

A third source of interest to members and their guests will be a view of progress made in the new Hall of Man.
