Nevertheless, this man, after suffering for twelve days and lightling against the jougle and the elements for his life, wrote, in his diary, "Whatever happens, God has been good to me." Four days later, going down a valley, "Upoe opened through," he wrote, and cites a rock crevice, where he avoided heavy storms, as an "example of how the Lord shepherfield me."
