**Tell More Details Of Adventures of Prisoner of War**

Jack Pierce, an outstanding Cranbrook School athlete of Bloomfield Hills, joined the Royal Canadian Air Force "to get action" and he's had it aplenty. High tribute was paid to Pliant Commander Sgt. Pierce recently at the Cranbrook School Chapel Services when letters from Jack, from R.C.A.F. headquarters and from the International Red Cross, were correlated and reviewed for the first time.

After many months of aching to get in the actual fighting, Jack took part in the historic bombing of Cologne and many other great triumphs before being shot down over Hamburg in July of 1942.

Reported as missing in action, Jack has just arrived through the International Red Cross to the effect that though wounded in the back and over the eye Jack is safe in a German prison camp and on the road to recovery.

Two of the four man crew were killed in the plane before it was shot down. The plane exploded in the air just a few seconds after Sgt. Pierce and one of his crew opened their parachutes. Four days passed before Jack was captured. Details are unknown but Jack is permitted to write home now via carefully censored post cards handled through the International Red Cross.

Before being shot down, Jack managed to write, "We miss have definite air superiority over the Jerry's. Our planes are better and the Germans are afraid to attack us in the air. Their anti-aircraft guns are more dangerous to us than their fighters."  
 Jack is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Pierce of Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.
