

**U of M Festival Program Told**

The Golden Jubilee May Festival will consist of six programs as has been the custom, for many years—four evening concerts, and matinees on Friday and Saturday.

This year the Philadelphia Orchestra will again participate for the eighth consecutive season. The festival will be opened Wednesday night with Beethoven's "Leonore" Overture No. 3, which opened the first festival, fifty years ago, and Saturday night Eugene Ormandy will bring the festival to a close in a performance of Verdi's Requiem, which also closed the first festival a half century ago.

Four symphonies will also be heard in the following: Tchaikovsky's Fifth, Shostakovich Fifth, Brahms No. 1, and Creston Op. 28.

The allocation of soloists is as follows: Wednesday evening—miscellaneous program with Salvatore Accardi, basso buffo, as soloist; Eugene Ormandy, conducting.

Thursday evening: Fritz Kreisler, violinist and Frederick Jagel, soloists. Eugene Ormandy—Hardin Van Deusen, conductor.

Friday afternoon: Astrid Varay, soprano, soloist. The Youth Chorus; Saul Gaston and Marguerite Hood, conductors.

Friday night: Miscellaneous concert, with Lily Pons, soloist; and Saul Gaston, conductor.

Saturday afternoon: All-Russian program with Vladimir Horowitz, piano, soloist; and Eugene Ormandy, conductor.

Saturday night: Verdi "Requiem" with the following soloists: Stella Roman, Kerstin Thorborg, Frederick Jagel and Alexander Kipina. Eugene Ormandy, conductor.
